Philippians 2:11 - Jesus Christ is \_\_\_\_\_: The confession of Jesus Christ as Lord reminds us to consider the great significance of this word “LORD” - *kurios* (*grk*), especially as it was understood by the early church, who used the Septuagint as their Bible – where *kurios* was consistently used to translate the tetragrammaton, standing for the name *Yahweh* or *Jehovah*!
