A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23 – Chapter 9

“Thou Preparest a Table Before Me”

Start each time of study with prayer. Ask God to speak to you personally through this study. Read the whole chapter first then go back and reread it to answer the questions. Some questions may take time, especially the personal ones. It's ok to take a couple of days before you answer some of them. Use the back of the sheet if you need more room.

Are you one of those sheep who has to stop and try everything along the path; even if it's not good for you? Do you sample things just to see what they are like? Read Proverbs 16:17 in several translations. My favorite is, “Those who are good travel a road that avoids evil; so watch where you are going---it may save your life.” GNB Take this to the Lord in prayer and determine in your heart that you will learn to “think twice” before trying or doing something.
